<b>Day 01</b>	<b>Home - Delhi</b>	<b>By Flight</b>	
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Arrive Delhi, meet and assist on arrival, welcome with fresh flower garlands and transfer to hotel. Overnight at hotel.

<b>Day 02</b>	<b>Delhi - Jaipur</b>	<b>By Road</b>	<b>258 KM/05 Hours</b>
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Early morning After Breakfast leave by private car to Jaipur , on arrival Jaipur transfer to Hotel. Evening free time for own activity or you can visit to local market for shopping.

**Jaipur** - The capital city of the state of Rajasthan also know as "Pink City" owes its name, its foundation and planning to the great warrior astronomer Maharaja Jai Singh II. The city of Jaipur has broad avenues excursion to Amber Fort. Elephant ride from the foothills of the Aravallis to the fort entrance. **Amber Fort**: At a distance of 11 kms from Jaipur, Amber was the ancient capital of Jaipur state. Afternoon, city tour of Jaipur. Visit the **City Palace** which has museum having an extensive collection of art, carpets, enamel ware and weapons; **Jantar Mantar** - the observatory built my Maharaja Jai Singh in 1728 and the façade of Hawa Mahal. Overnight at hotel.

<b>Day 03</b>	<b>Jaipur - Pushkar</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>145 KM/03 Hours</b>
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After breakfast start the bike tour with a ride to Pushkar.

**Pushkar**: Located just 11 km from Ajmer, Pushkar is a sacred little town in Rajasthan. Pushkar is famous for its scenic beauty and more than 400 temples. Pushkar has a number of exciting tourists' attractions including the famous **Pushkar Lake and Brahma Temple, Savitri Temple, Rangji or Ranganath Temple**. The annual **Pushkar Fair** held every year in Oct-November it's another major attraction for tourist.

<b>Day 04</b>	<b>Pushkar - Khejarla</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>110 KM/03 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride your bike toward Khajarla. Overnight at Khejarla.

Khejarla\_fort was built in 1611A.D. for Thakur Gopaldas ji, who was granted this Jagir for his great achievement in war. This 400 years old fort is now beautifully converted into the Heritage Fort with all comforts and luxury and is conceived as a place where past meets future. This luxury resort comprises of 40 rooms each and every room is richly and tastefully adorned with ethnic décor. These rooms are expressly designed for quiet, intimate moments, languorous daydreaming and restful solitude enjoyed by the Thakur's.

<b>Day 05</b>	<b>Khejarla - Osian</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>136 KM/03 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride your bike to Osian. Overnight at Osian

**Osian** is an ethnic village that is situated 65 kilometers off Jodhpur. Osian houses a cluster of **ancient Jain and Hindu temples**. These temples were constructed in between the 8th and the 12th century. Some of these old temples could not stand the ravages of time but most of these temples are intact till date.

<b>Day 06</b>	<b>Osian - Jaisalmer</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>240 KM/05 Hours</b>
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After breakfast, continue ride your bike tour to Jaisalmer. Overnight at Jaisalmer

<b>Day 07</b>	<b>Jaisalmer</b>		
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After breakfast full day free for own activity in Jaisalmer.

**Jaisalmer** - evokes a vivid picture of sheer magic and brilliance of the desert. Legend has it that Rawal Jaisal laid the foundation of the city in 1156 A.D. After consulting a local hermit by the name of Eesul. Tricuta was the hill chosen and Jaisal abandoned his old fort at Lodurva to establish this new capital. Over the years the remote location of Jaisalmer kept it almost untouched by outside influences and even during the days of Raj, Jaisalmer was the last to sign the Instrument of Agreement with the British. In Medieval times, its prosperity was due to its location on the main trade route linking India to Egypt, Arabia, Persia, Africa and the West.

**Tourist Attractions:** - The Jaisalmer Fort, Tazia Tower, Gadsisar Lake, Jain Temples, Havelis. Overnight at hotel.

<b>Day 08</b>	<b>Jaisalmer - Jodhpur</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>270 KM/05 Hours</b>
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After breakfast continue ride to Jodhpur.



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**Jodhpur** - Located at the edge of the Thar Desert, Jodhpur is a fascinating medieval city of Rajasthan. Founded by Rao Jodha, a Rajput king of valiant Rathore clan in 1459, Jodhpur is known for its amazing architectural splendor, vibrant culture, talented craftsmen, and lots of great shopping. The major tourist attractions in Jodhpur include its magnificent forts, palaces, cenotaphs, temples and gardens. Tourist Attractions: Mehrangarh Fort, Jaswant Thada.

<b>Day 09</b>	<b>Jodhpur - Ranakpur</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>157 KM/03 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride toward Ranakpur.

**Ranakpur** - The main tourist attractions of Ranakpur are its famous temples. Situated approximately 90km from Udaipur, the Ranakpur temple complex is a must see. The main Chaumukha temple (Four-Faced Temple) is dedicated to Adinath, the first tirthankar. The two other Jain temples in the complex are dedicated to Neminath and Parasnath. There is also the Sun temple and the Amba Mata temple near the main complex.

<b>Day 10</b>	<b>Ranakpur - Udaipur</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>91 KM/02 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride towards Udaipur.

**Udaipur:** One of the most romantic cities in Rajasthan, Udaipur is also known as the city of lakes. The marble palaces, beautifully laid out gardens and the lakes make Udaipur seem almost like a mirage. The City of Dawn, surrounded by the ancient Aravali Mountains and set on the edge of three lakes, is a brilliant kaleidoscope of narrow lanes flanked by bright stalls, gardens, lakes, palaces and temples. 'Udaipur', known as the lovely lakeside capital of Mewar.

**Other attractions:** - City Palace & Museum, Saheliyon-ki-Bari, Pratap Memorial, Pichhola Lake, Gulab Bagh. Overnight at hotel.

<b>Day 11</b>	<b>Udaipur - Chittorgarh</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>116 KM/03 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride to Chittorgarh.

**Chittorgarh:** the legendary city of Rajasthan is the epitome of Rajput pride, romance and spirit. Known as the city of bravery and sacrifice, Chittorgarh was one of the most fiercely contested seats of power in India.



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**Chittorgarh Fort:** One of the most formidable forts in India, Chittorgarh Fort is the symbol of the Rajput valiancy and supreme sacrifice. Vijay Stambh (Tower of Victory) built by Maharana Kumbha in 1440 AD to commemorate his victory over Mahmud Khilji, this 37 m high 9-storied tower is adorned by sculptures of Hindu deities. Kirti Stambh (Tower of Fame): Dedicated to Adinath, the 1st Jain Teerthankar, Kirti Stambh is a must visit tourist attraction in Chittorgarh.

<b>Day 12</b>	<b>Chittorgarh - Bundi</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>150 KM/03 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride your bikes to Bundi. Overnight at Bundi.

Bundi is a beautiful town and have importance in the History for Rajasthan. Bundi is surrounded by the Aravalli hills on the three sides and is circumscribed by a massive wall with four gateways. Interesting monuments including impressive medieval forts, palaces, havelis, temples with beautiful stone idols and chatris with carved pillars, along with a picturesque lake in the heart of the town, add to its charm. Bundi is very famous for its intricate carvings and murals.

<b>Day 13</b>	<b>Bundi - Ranthambore</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>122 KM/03 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride your bikes to Ranthambore. Overnight at Ranthambore.

<b>Day 14</b>	<b>Ranthambore</b>		
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After breakfast full day free for own activity in Ranthambore. Overnight at Ranthambore.

Ranthambore:- About 180 kms. to north-east of Jaipur, along the rolling hills of Vindhya and Aravali ranges lies the town of Sawai Madhopur. The town founded in 1765 AD was named after its founder Sawai Madho Singh-I of Jaipur. Today Sawai Madhopur is known for Ranthambhor, a Wildlife reserve and a place of historical importance.

**Tourist Attractions:** - Ranthambore National Park, Ranthambore Fort, Ranthambhor Ganesh Temple, Amareshwar Mahadeo Temple.

<b>Day 15</b>	<b>Ranthambore - Karauli</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>113 KM/03 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride your bikes to Karauli. Overnight at Karauli.

**Karauli** - The city of Karauli is considered one of the holiest cities in Rajasthan with a collection of more than almost 300 temples. Located almost 150 kms from Jaipur, the city founded in 1348 AD was earlier known as Kalyanpuri, after the local deity Kalyanji. The entire city is protected from all directions by a red sandstone wall. The wall is also strengthened by bastions at various points and gateways at strategic positions. The wall, though old still stands tall and dilapidated at a few spots.



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<b>Day 16</b>	<b>Karauli - Agra</b>	<b>By Bike</b>	<b>166 KM/04 Hours</b>
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After breakfast ride your bikes to Agra. Overnight at Agra.

**Agra** - Historians suggest Agra to be the Agravana in the epic Mahabharata. It is expected to be known as Agralapura during the medieval age. An archaeological fact pushes the existence of Agra back to three million years. The Lodhi dynasty ruled over Agra for a long time. It was in the onset of the sixteenth century that the Mughals took over the ruling of Agra from the hands of Lodhis.

<b>Day 17</b>	<b>Agra - Delhi</b> <b>Delhi - Depart</b>	<b>By Road</b> <b>By Flight</b>	<b>210 KM/04 Hours</b>
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After breakfast leave by private car to Delhi, on arrival Delhi transfer to international airport to catch flight to go back home.
